Hi there everyone!

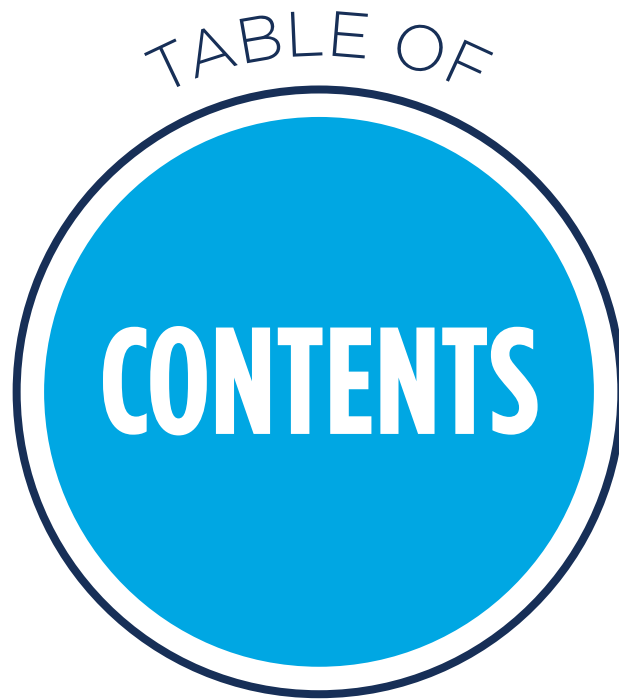

Prepare Yourself For An Adventure

Keep these things in mind:

Don't compare yourself to others. Comparing isn't productive. You'll either feel jealous (I will be worse than...) or prideful (I will be better than...). Both are negative responses. View all the mistakes and failures others have made as an opportunity for you to learn.

Resist the fear of the unknown. We're all fearful of the unknown but the good news is...you're not alone! You are filled with the power of the living God and surrounded by other leaders, coaches, and a groups team that is dedicated to helping you.

Healthy biblical community takes time to build. Decide in your heart, in this moment, that allowing your group time to build relationships and share life experiences is okay. Healthy biblical community does not happen overnight.

Don't watch all orientation videos in the same sitting. People are not wired to learn so many new things over a long period of time. We get brain fog and tired (remember the SAT!). Instead, break up your viewing into 1 video a day or a couple of videos per day. This will ensure you stay fresh, focused, and ready to jot down your questions and follow along in your listening guide.

For the next 4 modules we will address the top 10 questions every leader needs to know. There is a tendency we all have...and its to want to know everything before we begin something new. We've found that when a leader begins their leadership journey, providing them only what they NEED to know and then allowing what they SHOULD know to come along the way serves them best.

So, we've compiled the top 10 questions leaders NEED to know and we're excited to get started. As we get going, please make sure to jot down your notes and questions you have. If something isn't clear or you want to know a bit more, please know after you've completed these modules you will have a sit down 1v1 with your campus groups pastor to talk through any or all these 10 questions.

Q1: What types of groups do we have at Rush Creek?

1. Care Groups: finding freedom

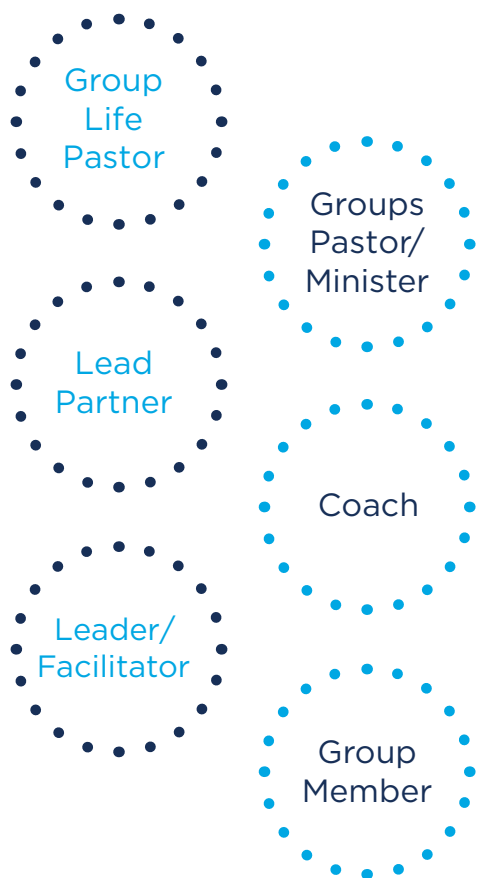
