

5 Day Devotional

This five day devotional will be taking a deeper dive into the sermon from this weekend. We will explore the theme of persecution, the boldness needed to proclaim the Gospel, and how the Holy Spirit empowers us to stand firm in our faith. Join us as we seek to deepen our understanding and application of these truths in our daily lives.

Day 1

Mark 13:9-13

The Christian journey is not free from challenges; in fact, Jesus Himself promised that we would face persecution for His name's sake. As we delve into Mark 13:9-13, we see a vivid portrayal of the trials and tribulations that await believers. Day 2

Matthew 24:9-14

Day 3

Luke 21:12-19

This paradoxical assurance calls us to a deep-seated trust in God's providence. Day 4

1 Corinthians 15:3-4

The core of the Gospel is succinctly encapsulated in 1 Corinthians 15:3-4, where Paul emphasizes that Christ died for our sins, was buried, and was raised on the third day. This foundational truth is the bedrock of our faith and the message we are called to proclaim. Day 5

Romans 10:9

Romans 10:9 presents the profound simplicity of the Gospel: confessing Jesus as Lord and believing in His resurrection leads to salvation. This verse underscores the importance of both faith and proclamation in our journey with Christ. As we confess and believe, we are not only securing our own salvation but are also called to lead others toward this transformative truth.

This final day of the devotional challenges us to consider the weight of our witness.
